





Introduction to the Lesson Plan

The aim of this lesson plan is to support you, as a community and adult educator, to deliver a session using the FARCE Climate Change Awareness – Compendium of Comedy and Learning resources, with adult learners in your group. Through this lesson plan, we will provide you with some sample activities that you can use to deliver one of the Comedy Resources from this Compendium in a group-work setting. When preparing to deliver these activities in your group, it is important that you are prepared to use the Comedy for Climate Change resources. For this, we recommend that you complete the relevant modules from our FARCE In-service Training Programme, before delivering these activities in your practice.

Introduction to the Climate Change: Wasteland

As climate change takes effect right across the globe since 1970, more than 800,000 km² of Amazonian rainforest has been lost, mostly to provide cattle pasture. Other causes are crop cultivation (namely soy & palm), yielding timber, forest fires, exploitation of resources for biofuels, mining, and extraction. For a sense of perspective, the area lost is the more land than Ireland, Portugal, Croatia, Finland and Great Britain combined. That's more than 300 football pitches worth of animal habitat. This has far reaching effects that impact our entire planet.

There is an increasing trend to be more aware about how we live as individuals and how we can make a difference by the way we live in our homes.

Getting to know the Resources

In this section, we will provide you with a brief introduction to the Comedy Resource that you will use in when delivering this lesson plan in a group of adult learners.

What is covered in the Comedy Resource?

This Comedy Resource is a cartoon which depicts how one family have chosen to live while everything around them is destroyed. It aims to highlight the damage to our environment worldwide while demonstrating that positive change is possible. One home at a time





This format provides strong visuals and instantly engaging, horrifying and funny at the same time. The shock tactic of this piece highlights individual issues which the learners can discuss and perhaps be encouraged to make changings in their own homes and also have a greater understanding of the threat we all face. Using videos for learning makes it a lot easier for students to understand various topics and ideas. This resource allows the tutor to make copies of the cartoon for the learners to take away with then so they might continue to reflect on what they have learnt

Applying this Comedy Resource

By encouraging participants to become involved in the session by expressing their opinions aids the learning process. Discussions on this subject can become heated so it is important to remind the learners we are all here to learn and not to make personal judgements on others. Making the learners aware of the range of resources will make the session fun and memorable and may encourage learners to make future use if the FARCE site.

30 minutes	Participants are given a copy of the cartoon. They break into smaller groups and they discuss the resource. They share their first reactions. The tutor guides them in identifying the different issues that are raised The group can break into groups of 2 or 3 and using their own or the suggested links research one of the topic that interests them most. The groups then share one piece of information each. These are written in the board The tutor shows the Home Energy video and the same procedure is followed The tutor opens a discussion about how there. learners feel about taking individual responsibility In particular how this is reflected in their own homes.
