





Introduction to the Lesson Plan

The aim of this lesson plan is to support you, as a community and adult educator, to deliver a session using the FARCE Climate Change Awareness – Compendium of Comedy and Learning resources, with adult learners in your group. Through this lesson plan, we will provide you with some sample activities that you can use to deliver one of the Comedy Resources from this Compendium in a group-work setting. When preparing to deliver these activities in your group, it is important that you are prepared to use the Comedy for Climate Change resources. For this, we recommend that you complete the relevant modules from our FARCE In-service Training Programme, before delivering these activities in your practice.

Introduction to the Climate Change topic The School Run

The familiar morning ritual of sending children out to school is the vehicle for this resource Our everyday needs are currently fairly simple. This resource imagines what our lives could be like is the sustainable goals set out in the Paris agreement and addressed again in Cop 26 have not been met.

In the Paris Agreement, nations agreed that they would:

- 1. Reduce their greenhouse gas emissions, and invest in renewable energy sources, like wind and solar power.
- 2. Prevent global temperatures from warming by more than 2°C, and try to keep the increase as low as 1.5°C.
- 3. Help less-developed countries become more environmentally friendly, by supporting them financially.
- 4. Review progress on the Agreement every five years.

This resource focuses on how climate change is affecting Europe and includes links to reports of recent events such as wildfires, floods, air quality etc

What is covered in the Comedy Resource?

This Comedy Resource uses the 'morning checklist' when sending a child off to school The caring mother prepares her son for every eventuality as he leaves the house.

The ridiculous situation served to drive home the facts

The participant will be introduced to the concept of disaster as climate change takes hold but the activities will address what positive steps are being taken to avert disaster and bring about sustainable change.

Applying this Comedy Resource

It is most useful not to prepare the learners before they watch this resource. but allow it to speak for itself.

It is a very short piece so the lesson plan can easily be adapted if not much time is available, or it can provide a foundation for addressing each climate issue in turn as she lists the situations, he may encounter in his short trip to school

Links for further research are provided. If time is short, or sessions can be extended by allowing participants to carry out some research themselves and present their findings

Links to 3 other resources from the website are provided. The tutor may choose to use whichever is appropriate.

They are for learners with different ages and abilities They feed back 3 points to the whole group and these facts are written on the board by a participant who volunteers.
